Lent and Poverty

The season of Lent, which we are now in, reminds me of Luke 4: 18-21. "The Spirit of God is upon me: God has anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor. God has sent me to proclaim release to the captives . . . and to set at liberty those who are oppressed Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your ears."

The poor in our society are commonly misunderstood to be those who have less than they need. Those of lesser worth, who arouse pity who are inferior in quality or value, and finally those

who are unproductive. Dr. A. James Armstrong once said, "There are three basic types of poverty in the world: material, psychological, and cultural-spiritual." Material poverty is the lack of fundamental necessities in life, such as food, clothing, housing, and medicine. It means not having enough money or credit. It means not having a job or even the possibility of one.

Psychological poverty happens when one is not accepted, esteemed, needed, understood, desired, and loved. If these needs are not met, persons develop a low self-image and will often fear or even hate themselves. Some people see themselves as ugly, inferior, or without dignity. They may even see themselves as unwanted and/or undesirable. A person can be materially rich while being psychologically poor and conversely.

Spiritual poverty is the third and deepest level of poverty. This is the worst type of poverty because it deprives persons of their fundamental humanity as shaped and determined by the Creator. Some even curse their own people and their God for making them to be what they are.

In the light of the liberating life and message of Jesus, the season of Lent is a wonderful time to reflect upon our own spirituality and the poverty which may exist in our own world. May our spirits soar as we discover who we are, and more important, what we were created to be! There are many Lenten offerings for you to partake in this year at Trinity United Methodist Church. I hope you will plan on participating in as many as you can. In the words of Yogi Bera, "There are plenty of places and ways to go. Which one(s) are for you?"

Trinity on the Go: Northampton & Annual Bulb Festival

Thursday March 7, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. No cost for program— Meet in Trinity's Parking lot

We will start at Smith's arboretum at the Annual bulb festival. The Botanic Garden's Spring Bulb Show is a Smith College tradition that began in the early 1900s. Ordinarily blooming at different times during the spring, over 8,000 bulbs are coaxed into flowering simultaneously, providing an explosion of color against the backdrop of the departing winter. An impressive display of crocuses, hyacinths, narcissi, irises, lilies, tulips and non-hardy South African bulbs offer an early glimpse of spring. Lunch will be in downtown Northampton. In the afternoon we will tour Smith College Museum of Fine Arts. SCMA is recognized as a leading academic museum, contributing meaningfully to Smith College's mission to educate women of promise for lives of distinction and purpose. They welcome about 35,000 visitors a year, including Five College students, staff and faculty, and visitors from the region and around the world. The museum's collection now comprises more than 27,000 objects, representing the diversity of art and material culture across periods and geographies. Registration is required


