
This project is funded by bequests from the generosity of past Trinity members of the United Methodist Women (United Women in Faith).

Yes, it is just July, but we need to get started on the CROP Hunger Walk now so we can be ready. Last year, Trinity raised almost \$3,000 and had 15 walkers. Our goal this year is \$4,000 and double the number of walkers – we're hoping for at least 30. The walk will take place again at Trinity and starts with registration at 1:00 pm with the walk starting at 2:00 and going through Forest Park.

No one in this world should be hungry. That's why the CROP Hunger Walk is more than just a yearly gathering. It's a movement that's 55 years strong, made up of compassionate people in more than 500 communities across the U.S.

The steps we take - and the funds we raise together will provide life-saving support including emergency food and resources, along with the seeds, tools and programs that will help families feed themselves in the future. For a \$20 donation, a family will be supplied with chickens for a constant supply of eggs. Thirty dollars will equip a household with a water filter for a constant supply of clean water. Sixty dollars will supply three families with home gardening to raise nutritious veggies.


Trinity Book Club
