# Notes

#### **Trustee News**

Good news! The elevator project is finally moving along. It's been a tremendous amount of behind the scenes work since we, as a church, voted in January to move ahead with the accessibility project. The ITISTEES building has been swarming with engineers assessing conditions, we've been in contact with the building and code enforcement folks to make sure everything is in compliance, and we've had discussions and bids from multiple contractors. The project was put out to bid in early July and the results were a bit discouraging - everything came back quite a bit higher than our estimator had anticipated and was over

our allotted budget. After much discussion, deliberation, and discernment we decided to make some changes in the plan. The lift that will access the chapel has been eliminated - partly due to cost and partly due to the amount of space we would lose in the Chapel due to code requirements, which would have taken almost one third of one side of the Chapel.

We have worked out our budget shortfall and picked our General Contractor - A J Crane Co. from Chicopee. He has secured the building permit; we have ordered the elevator from Otis; we have contracted to begin asbestos abatement and an update to the fire alarm system. We are hoping to begin the demolition on September 15th. Our best guess is that the elevator shaft and all of the related work will be completed before Christmas, with the installation of the elevator (which takes 4-6 weeks by itself) to begin just after Boars Head and be completed no later than March 31st (just before Easter!)

There will be some disruption to our normal way of life at Trinity over the next several months. The parking lot entrance will likely be closed off for most, if not all of that period. The east transept will be sealed off to contain construction debris as much as possible, but we may still need to seal off the organ for a period of time to prevent dust infiltration. While we will try to minimize the inconvenience, we will be living in a construction zone through the fall and ask for your patience.

Another exciting project is the major upgrade to our Sanctuary sound system. We have upgraded pieces several times in the past 30 years but this time it will be much more extensive. We are abandoning the old style single large speaker and installing 6 speakers throughout the Sanctuary, which will give us a much more balanced sound and eliminate the several dead zones that we currently have. We are also installing a digital processor to balance the sound and auto adjust the microphones for louder and softer speakers, adding a couple of new microphone jacks, and upgrading our wireless mics. The system should be completely up and running in the next couple of weeks and we will be adjusting things as we go over the fall for best live sound and streaming.

#### **CROP Walk 2025**

#### GET YOUR WALKING SHOES READY!

On Sunday, October 5 at 1:00 pm, we the front lawn of Trinity Church. In years

the walk. Since COVID suspended the in-person group walk for 2 years, we have struggled to get the donations back up and the number of walkers back up. We're hoping that this is the year to return to being the top fundraisers in the Greater Springfield Walk. Our goal is to raise at least \$4,000 and have at least 25 walkers.

As an incentive, Greater Springfield CROP Walk has been granted Matching Funds. For every dollar you donate ONLINE, a gift from the closing of Bethesda Lutheran Church will match your donation up to \$20,000. Your donation of \$50 is enough to provide five, two-week food packets for nourishment and support. Your donation of \$80 provides chickens for four families, giving them a constant supply of eggs, helping children become stronger and healthier. Your gift of \$100 provides two beehives, a flood resistant option that creates stable jobs working with nutritious honey that can be eaten and sold.

In these times of government cuts in funding these programs, it has become our duty to pick up the slack. Remember, 25% of the funds we raise stay local and benefit the Western Mass Food Bank, Lorraine's Soup Kitchen and Open Pantry.

No one in this world should be hungry. That's why the CROP Hunger Walk is more than just a gathering of people in a place. We're part of a movement, taking steps and raising funds together to provide meals for those in our own community who need them - and supporting programs that create greater food security in communities all around the world. Please join us in the fight against hunger. The steps we take and funds we raise will make a difference in the lives of others.


#### **Single Together to Meet Again**


choice. We meet monthly for a meal and a time of socializing. All singles are welcome.




### Are You Interested in Becoming an Acolyte?
