We also need cookies – lots of them. Drop-off of cookies times:

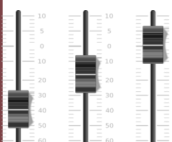
- Thursday, January 8, 5-8 p.m.

Epiphany Sunday –January 4, 2026 Liturgy for the Sacrament of Holy Communion

The Great Thanksgiving Epiphany (Adapted)

Leader: The Lord be with you all.

People: And also with you.

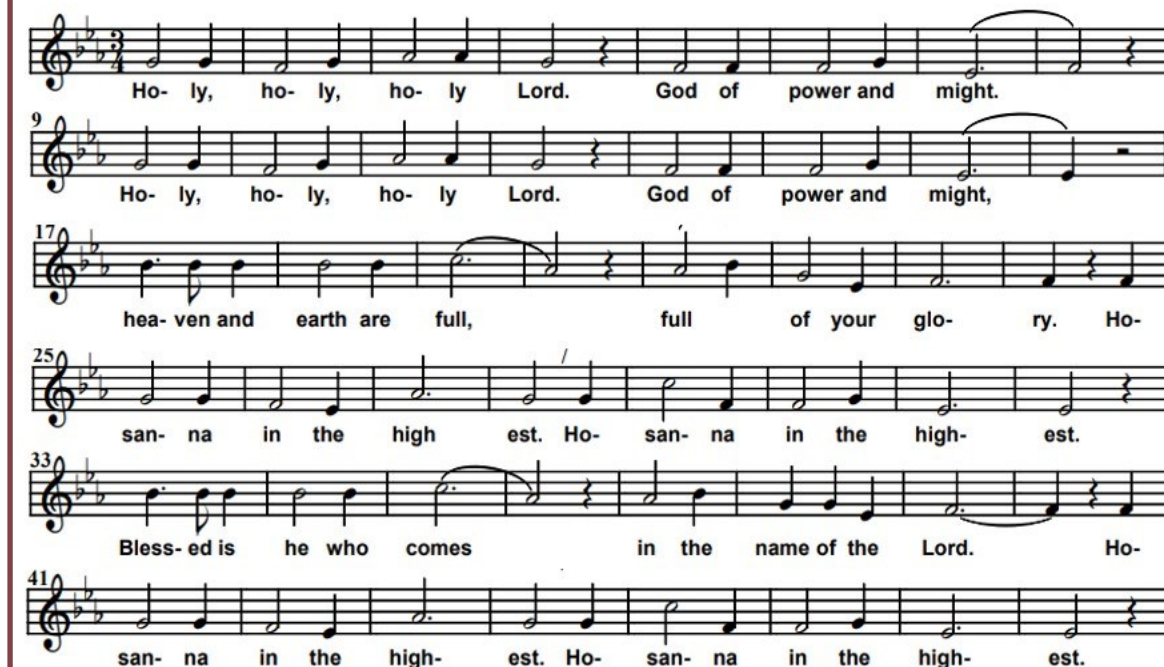
Leader: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Leader: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, creator of heaven and earth. Before the mountains were brought forth, or you had formed the earth, from everlasting to everlasting, you alone are God. You created light out of darkness and brought forth life on earth. You formed us in your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast. You delivered us from captivity, made covenant to be our sovereign God, and spoke to us through your prophets. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Liturgy for the Sacrament of Holy Communion (continued)

Leader: Holy are you and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ, in whom you have revealed yourself, our light and our salvation. You sent a star to guide the magi to where the Christ was born; and in your signs and witnesses, in every age and through all the world, you have drawn people from all places, to light of your presence.

Leader: We remember how on the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat: this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Leader: When the supper was over Jesus took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you, this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Leader: And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith:


All: 

Christ has died, Christ is ris - en, Christ will come a gain!

SUNDAY MORNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR CHILDREN

The Children's Table offers coloring pages and other materials to help children feel welcome and comfortable in church. The table is located in the rear of the sanctuary. Please return supplies.

Trinity's Nursery & Child Care for children birth-4 yrs. is open during the worship service.

Trinity has a dedicated staff member responsible for providing a safe and engaging atmosphere for children during services. Cody Minahan has worked in the education field for over 10 years with experience ranging from preschool all the way up to high school! We also have a weekly volunteer. An usher can direct you.

Trinity's Christian Education Classes for K - Grade 12.

LIGHT@9 is on break until Sunday, February 1, 2026. It usually runs every Sunday mid-September through mid-May. **LIGHT@9-Children** is for Kindergarten through grade 5. **LIGHT@9-Youth** is for gr. 6-12.

Chapel Kids is a worship service designed for children Ages 5-13 yrs.

Chapel Kids is on break until Sunday, February 1, 2026. It usually runs mid-September through mid-May every Sunday except Communion Sunday, which is the first Sunday of every month. It begins at the beginning of the middle hymn, and ends after the benediction. It is located in Grace Chapel which is through the side door in the front right of the sanctuary around the corner.
