The Great Thanksgiving After Pentecost

Leader: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Liturgy for the Sacrament of Holy Communion (continued)

Leader: Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. Your Spirit anointed him to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, and to announce that the time had come when you would save your people. He healed the sick, fed the hungry, and ate with sinners. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit. At his ascension you exalted him to sit and reign with you at your right hand.

Leader: On the night in which he gave himself up for us, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat: this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Leader: When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, and gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Leader: And so, in remembrance of these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

Leader: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood. By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast at his heavenly banquet. Through your Son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and forever.

Trinity has a dedicated staff member responsible for providing a safe and engaging atmosphere for children during worship services. We welcome Trinity member, Ashby Pack as Trinity's Nursery Care Coordinator. We also have a weekly volunteer. An usher can direct you.

Trinity's Christian Education Classes **LIGHT@** are on Hiatus until Mid- Sept.

You can sign up Mid-September for fall 2026 classes. **LIGHT@9-Children**, for Kindergarten-through grade 5, usually meets downstairs in Vincent Hall. **LIGHT@9-Youth**, for gr. 6-12, usually meets on the top floor. The classes will run on Sundays from mid-September through mid-May.

Chapel Kids is a Worship Service for Children 5–13 yrs. is on Hiatus until Mid-Sept.

Chapel Kids usually begins at the beginning of the middle hymn, and ends after the benediction. When it resumes it will be located in Grace Chapel, which is through the side door in the front right of the sanctuary around the corner.
