



L: Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ, who left the comforts of glory to live among a people estranged from God. By his life and example, he taught us that it was possible to love our neighbors and live together as family. By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your Church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

L: On the night in which he gave himself up for us, Jesus took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Take, eat: this is my body, given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." When the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, and gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this, all of you; this cup is the new covenant in my blood, poured out for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."
